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TOWN CENTRE THROUGH ROUTES

Navigating across Kingston by bicycle can be daunting even for the experienced cyclist or long-term resident but some quieter and safer routes have been preserved or created.



East - West routes (Blue routes)

Two options are shown:

- The more southerly goes from Portsmouth Road via the town centre and the cycle crossing **A** to Old London Road out towards north Kingston and New Malden.
- The more northerly shows the raised shared path (bridge **B**) by the station that heads parallel with Wood Street towards Bentalls and John Lewis and Kingston Bridge.

South - North routes

● Pink route: Portsmouth Road – Kingston Bridge

This route takes the slightly intermittent cycle lane on the busy Portsmouth Road on an important North – South cyclable route through the market square (**C** Note: shared with pedestrians) and over Kingston Bridge, towards Teddington or Bushy Park.

● Green Route: Surbiton – Teddington Lock

Ewell Road heading north towards Canbury Gardens, the River Thames and Teddington Lock. Take the green path and shared crossing **D** to the left of College roundabout into the town centre or back out.

● Red route: Berrylands – Richmond Park

At **E** there is a contra-flow cycle lane. At **F** there is a gap in the wall leading to the crossings. There is a short stretch at **G** Queen Elizabeth Road where heading north it's essential to dismount and walk on the pavement and we recommend walking even when heading south in the direction of the traffic.

● Purple route: University – Ham

This route links the quiet suburban roads behind the main university campus on Penrhyn Road via a crossing at **H** to the main shopping streets (Eden Street / Clarence Street) and via the shared paths on Castle Street **I** and round the back of Bentalls store to the crossing **J** towards Canbury and Ham.
